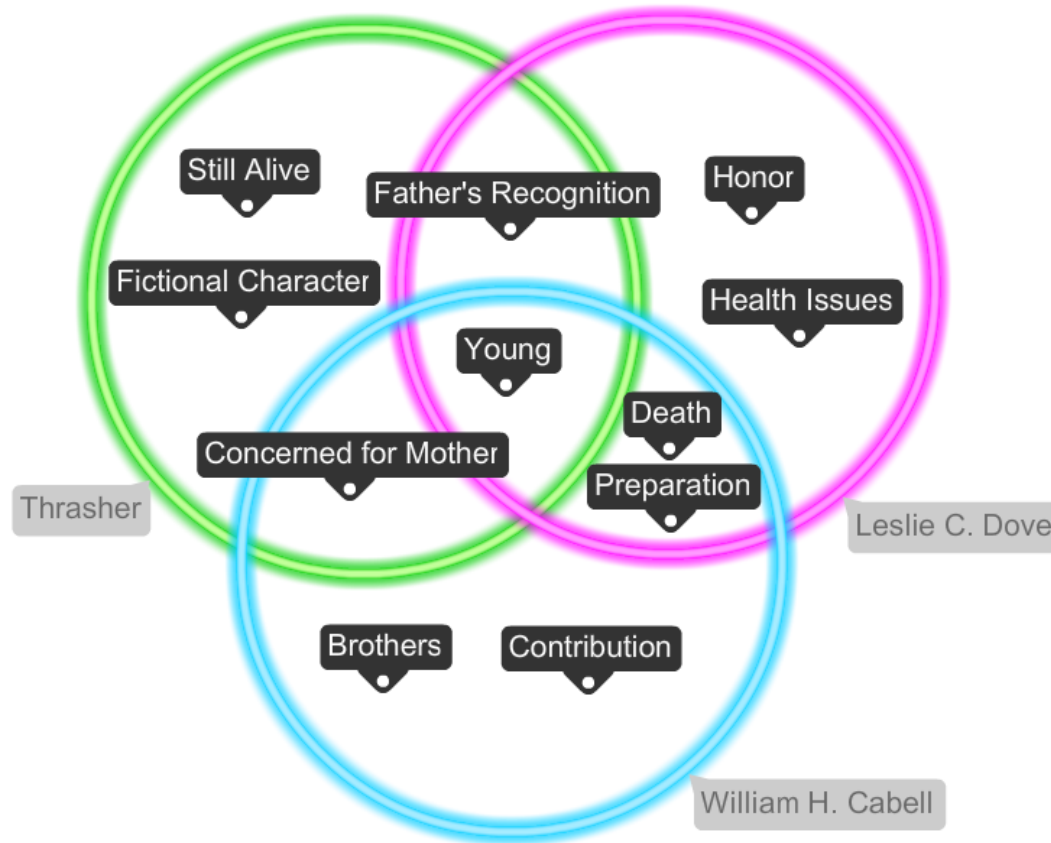
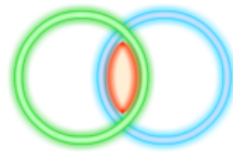

Items:

- **Honor**
