Your description should help someone who has not seen the image to visualize it.	Describe your personal feelings, associations, and judgments about the image. Always anchor your subjective response in something that is seen. For example, "I see . . . , and it makes me think of . . ."	Record prior knowledge based on experience, study, assumptions, and intuitions.	Make conclusions based on your observation and knowledge.
